Aspiration

We were delighted to receive our Gold Artsmark award in August. This recognises the high quality journey with the arts in our school over the past two years, marking a significant achievement for us. The Artsmark award is a national award and marks the culmination of purposeful planning, partnership work with local arts and cultural partners and fantastic exploration of the arts in our school. Some of the activities such as our "Lost Words" project in Early Years, play writing in year 6 with the Theatre Royal, brass tuition in year 5, singing performances with Young Voices and Snape Maltings through to our Arts leader led whole school Minecraft-themed whole school arts day are just part of the whole school team effort to ensure that the arts are a key part of experiences for our children. Working with local artists such as Alfie Carpenter in partnership with the Bury Arts society has been a delight and inspired our creative thinking.

We welcomed the Arts Council England to visit and see our amazing school and have been invited to host visits form other educators in England.

Our Early Years team are embarking on a project around developing children's language and curiosity as part of Anglian Learning's creativity collaboratives project, funded by the Arts Council. This looks to be an exciting development and the team are looking forward to working across the Trust with other settings to share good practice.
