



SEND News from Mrs Wakeman

This week I would like to provide some tips on managing emotions with your child especially if they are showing traits of autism:

Attune to your child, let them know that you understand living in that difficult emotion – get down to their level.

Validate the emotion, even use the language of feeling to model that.

Contain it – reassure and make the unbearable bearable. Soothe – allow space and time to calm. Sometimes that might be away from a cuddle – having some alone time!

When they are dysregulated – you may need to draw aside to breathe and keep yourself calm. Make sure you build in time for yourself to recharge!
