

Ways to help your child...

We are sending home weekly reading books, please read with your child and record this in their reading records.

Your child will have termly homework challenges, try to complete one of these per week, any log-in details should be found in your child's reading record or homework book.

RE / PHSE

In RE we will be asking the Big Question 'Why do Christians believe they are people on a mission?' after half term we will be learning about how Sikhs put their beliefs about equality into practice.

In PSHE we will be learning about relationships and sex education and healthy and safer lifestyles.

Science

In Science, we will be looking at the human digestive system. Children will describe the function of key organs in the digestive system, identify the types of human teeth and investigate factors that impact our dental health.

Maths

In maths in year 3 we will explore measure, fractions, multiplication and division.

In year 4 we will be continuing with our multiplication and division content. Following this, we will move onto working out perimeter of shapes.
